County & State of Virginia being in perfect disposition of mind
& memory do make this my last Will & Testament. In manner
& form as followeth that is to say I Will & bequeath to my beloved
Wife Esther her Lawful Dower of my Landed Estates During her
life & also my three Negroes Nell Jacob & David & also my personal
Estates her Natural life & at her Death the aforesaid Negroes &
Personal property to be equally divided amongst my five daughters
after Fifty Pounds being paid to my Granddaughter Elizabeth
Loveless out of my personal Estate Viz Priscilla Cawood Esther Walker
Elizabeth Berry Mary Ann Cawood & Rebecca Lewis only the above
three mentioned Negroes I will & desire that as soon as they
arrive to the age of Forty five that They be set free to all Intents
& purposes as free persons according to the laws of the State & when
their ages is as followeth Nell forty one years of age David
Twenty two and Jacob twenty

I Will & bequeath my son Benjamin Cawood & his heirs all my
Land lying on the west side of my ^{mill} creek to him & his heirs
for ever. To my son Thomas I Will & bequeath to him & his
heirs a tract of Land I Bought of Samuel M Reynolds where
he now lives on to him & his heirs for ever. To my son Joseph
I Will & Bequeath to him all my Land lying on the East
side of my Mill creek including my mill & joining my
son Thomas's Tract to him & his heirs forever also to my
son Berry I will & bequeath to him one hundred Dollars
To my son Stephen Cawood deceased 6 children one hundred
pounds to be Equally divided & paid to them as they come
of age by My son Thomas Benjamin & Joseph Cawood.
Berry Cawood paid when called on by Thomas Benjamin &
Joseph each paying an equal part. To my son John deceased
& children I Will & bequeath to them the part of Land belong-
ing to me that my son John Cultivated in his lifetime
with A reasonable quantity of firewood & Timber to support
said place for the term of fifteen years then said Land to go
to my son Benjamin as above mentioned
A Bond I have on my son Thomas Cawood for forty pounds
by his paying an equal part with my son Benjamin & Joseph

of one hundred pounds to my son Stephen Cawood Deceast
 Children as afore mentioned & his equal part with Benjamin
 & Joseph of one hundred Dollars to my son Berry Cawood
 Deceast Children as afore mentioned the aforesaid Bond
 now in my possession to be void & of no effect & otherwise
 to Remain in full force & Virtue Also I Will & bequeath
 to my son Thomas ^{Cawood} five Dollars I Will that all my just
 Debts & funeral Charges be paid out of my personal estate
 by my Executors hereafter mentioned and named and that
 David my negro man be hired out to pay the same

I Will & nominate my beloved Wife Esther Cawood Executrix
 and Benjamin Cawood my ^{son} Executor of this my last Will
 & Testament. And I do hereby revoke all former Wills
 by me made here tofore In Witness hereof I have here-
 unto set my hand & seal this sixth Day of November
 In the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred

 the said Stephen Cawood as his last Will & Testament in the
 presence of Each of us together who
 signed as Witnesses

This last Will & Testament of Stephen Cawood
 dec^d was presented in Court proven by the Oath of Daniel
 Arnett Nathan Taylor & James Henderson the subscri-
 -bing Witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded. And at
 a Court held for said County the 19th day of March 1846,
 Esther Cawood the Executrix herein named appeared
 in Court & refused the Executorship. And on the motion of
 Benjamin Cawood the other Executor herein named who
 took ^{the oath} of an Executor prescribed by Law & entered into and
 acknowledged his bond with William Allison & Bazil
 Talbuth his securities in the sum of four thousand dollars
 Conditioned as the law directs a Certificate is therefore
 granted for the probat of the said Will in due form.
