In witness whereof I have humbly besought my dear friends to be present and to be witnesses of it. I do hereby give and bequeath unto my dear wife the old gray mare and Cow in her part and the Bed and Cloths and Corn in the year of the Family and the other two Acres and Cattle and the Debt to be paid to the Deceased Robert. Mary Rose and Ruth and the Child who is with of alive and if any one of them Dies their Part is to be Divided amonge the rest; and all other things is to be sold; and I do constitute John Kirkham and Ann Hadden to be Executors of this my last Will and Testament; for my children I make provision when I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 29 Day of September in the year of our Lord 1778 Thomas Hadden testifies present
