I Thomas John of Washington County and State of Virginia being Very weak in Body but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be to God, therefore Calling unto mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make & ordain this my last Will and Testament, that is to Say principally and first of all I Recommend my Soul to Almighty God who gave it, and my Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in Christian Burial at the Discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the power of Almighty God, And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to Bless me in this life, I Give, demise, and Bequeath in the following Manner, and first the Expences of a decent Burial to be Given to my Executors, and V^z all that is found to be belonging to Me to be Equally divided among Martha Harris, and Thomas Thomas, and Abijah Thomas, and the children of Anna Marten deceas^d, V^z the fourth part of my Estate to be equally divided among them, And make and ordain Thomas Thomas, and Abijah Thomas, to be Executors of this my last will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly disavow, Revoke, and disannul all and every other former wills, Testaments, legacies, Requests, by me in any ways before named Willed and bequeathed. Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto Set my hand and seal the Day and year above Written, Signed, Sealed & declared by the S^d Thomas John as his Last will and testament in the presence of

And on the motion of Thomas Thomas & Abijah Thomas the executors therein named who took the oath of an executor prescribed by law & entered into & acknowledged their bond with Arthur Brocken & Robert Brown their securities in the sum of five hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs a certificate granted them for the probat of the said Will in due form.

made & Ratified this twenty second day of October In the year of Our Lord one thousand and eight hundred & six - Witnesseth That Thomas Brown aged seventeen years & ten months of the County of Washington & Borough of Abingdon & State of Virginia of the one part, - By these presents doth put himself Apprentice to Samuel Brown of the County Borough & State aforesaid Cabinet maker & By & with the Consent of his Father William Brown Doth Voluntarily & of his own free will & accord Bind himself to the aforesaid Samuel Brown to learn the Art & Mystery of a Cabinet maker; to serve from the day of the date hereof untill the term of three years & two months, Is fully Completed & ended; And During all Which time the said Apprentice his said Master faithfully shall serve his secrets keep; his lawfull commands every where gladly Obey; He shall not do damage to his said Master, or see It to be done by Others without letting or giving notice to his said Master. He shall not waste his said Masters goods nor lend them unlawfully to others; He shall not Commit Fornication; nor Contract Matrimony within the 3^d term. At Cards Dice or any unlawful Games he shall not play; whereby his said Master may be damaged by or with his own goods or goods of others: He shall not absent himself Day nor Night from his said Masters service; without his leave; nor haunt Ale houses Taverns or Play houses; But in all things behave himself as a faithful apprentice ought to do during the said term And the said Master of the other part shall use the utmost of his endeavours to teach or Cause to be taught and Instructed the said Apprentice; In the Trade & Mystery he now professeth occupieth or followeth and procure and provide for him the said Apprentice Meat Drink Apparel, Washing
