Day of January In the year of our lord Christ one thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy seven Thomas Jones of the County of Washington in the Colony of Virginia being Perly well and wits in Body but of perfect mind and memory and Calling to mind my mortality and that it is appointed for all men to Die Do make and ordain this to be my Last Will and Testament ~~~~ Inprimis or first of all I Recommend my Soul to God who gave it me And my Body to the Earth to be buried in it a Christian manner at the Discretion of my Executors, and as touch such worldly Estate wherewith it hath Pleased God in his Goodness to Bless me I order and Dispose of in the manner and form following VViz. First of all I Give and bequath unto my well beloved Wife Diana the third Part of all my Estate both Real and Personal After that all my Just Debtis and Funeral Charges are Paid ~~~~ Item and to my Son Laughly Lickewise Give and Bequath the sum of Ten Pound to be levied out of the remainder of my Estate ~~~~ Item And the remainder of my Estate shall be Equally Divided between my Wife Diana my son Laughly, Robert William James & Thomas Jones and my three Daughters Agary Mulla and Elizabeth Jones ~~~~ Item But if Either Eight of them Formentioned Legacies my Laughly Robert William James or Thomas Agary Mulla or Elizabeth Jones shall Die in their minority it is my Will therefore that their Part of the Estate shall be Equally Divided between the seven Surviving ones and no on ~~~~ Item I Likewise make and ordain my Wife Diana Jones to be my whole Executrix of this my Will and Testament ~~~~ Item Likewise all other Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made Do renounce and Declare all them Void and of none Effect and do Declare this and none other to be my Last will ~~~~ Signed Published and Pronounced in the Presence
