I Thomas McCauley of Washington County Virginia Being of body of sound and disposing Mind thanks be to God for his Mercies Not failing to Mend the Mortality of My body and that it is appointed unto all Men one to Die Do Make this as followeth My last will and Testament

I Do allow My Executors to pay all My just Debts and funeral Charges and collect all Debts Due to Me by others

I Do give and bequeath to My beloved Wife one third of My personal property and her Right of Dower in the Land bequeathed to My Sons Samuel and Thomas By this My last will and Testament

I Do give and bequeath to My Son James McCauley one third of the tract of Land I Now have upon containing 215 Acres to be laid off on that part of Land where My Son James Now Resideth in Such a Manner as Not to Include any part of the Improvement on that part of the place where I Now Reside If there is Land Enough Without it and one third of the Meadow Now in Cultivation on My part of place for four years after the Date hereoff and I Do allow My Son James to pay ten pounds in trade to My Son Samuel In consideration of a Saddle horse given by My Son Samuel to My Daughter Janet White I Do likewise allow him to pay three pounds yearly from this Date to Me for My support During My life If Demanded of him

I Do give and bequeath to My Sons Samuel and Thomas the Remaining two parts of My Land whereon I Now Reside and the Remaining two parts My personal property to be by them and their heirs wholly possessed and freely Enjoyed for Ever and I Do by these presents appoint My Sons Samuel and Thomas My whole and Sole Executors of this My last Will and Testament in Witness Whereoff I have hereunto set My hand and Seal this Fifth Day of March one thousand Eight hundred and seven

Evans of Washington County and State of Virginia for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred Dollars, It being for a Bond Given him the 8 day of October 1806 Due against the first day of March 1807 To David Martin Do Bargain and Sell and deliver unto the said David Martin and his heirs forever, the following Property, To wit, One Waggon and four Oxen two head of Horse beasts two mens Saddles and bridles, and one Womans Saddle, five head of horned Cattle, and all our House hold & Kitchen furniture such as beds and furniture Chests Stables pewter pots & bake ovens, It being our property and in our possession, at the time of executing this instrument and we the said John Young & Jere T. Evans for ourselves or selves our heirs &c. do covenant with the said David Martin this heirs that we for ourselves & our heirs will forever warrant and defend the said property above mentioned to the said David Martin & his heirs against the Claims of of all persons whomsoever, Further the said David Martin doth agree to let the sd John Young & Jere T. Evans have the use of the above property till he calls for it, yet upon Condition never theless that if the said John Young & Jere T. Evans or their heirs &c. shall ever and truly pay the said David Martin and his heirs &c. the sum of five Hundred Dollars then this bill of sale and every thing contained therein shall be void and of none effect otherwise to remain in full Virtue, —
