town of Shingdon, the following property to wit; one feather bed, four

Bedstead, one suit of bed curtains, one bed tick tick, three boxes of clothes
one trunk containing clothes, two straw bed mats, six split bottom
Chairs, one Table & Cradle, one small box & trunk, one pot, one tea
kettle one Skillet, two tubs, two barrels, one piggin, three stools & crocke-
ry ware, ten knives & forks, two bread trays, one salt seller, one flour
barrel, one lot of family books, nine silver tea spoons, three Setts to

and sold, for and in consideration of the just sum of twenty pounds
lawful money of Virginia to me in hand paid by the said William King & Co.
