In the name of God amen I William Rhoads of the County of Washington County being sick and weak of body but of sound and disposing memory for which I thank my God and Calling to mind the uncertainty of human life and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in the following manner that is to say 1st I give to my two sons Joseph Rhoads and William Rhoads all my land lying on sinking creek with all the appurtenances therunto belonging each my said sons to have an equal moiety thereof with all my stock of horses Cows and hogs and all my farming utensils that is now on said land also my waggow and gears with every thing belonging thereto. Secondly I give to my daughter Sarah Rhoads my negro girl named Bet also fifty pounds to be paid to her as hereafter directed I also give to my said Daughter Sarah all my household and kitchen furniture of every description and denomination with all her mothers wearing apparel to be by her disposed of and distributed as she in her Judgment and prudence may think most to the advantage of my family. Thirdly I give to my daughter Jane Rhoads one decent horse with saddle and bridle and one hundred pounds to be paid to her in cash as hereafter directed

62. fourthly. I give to my daughter Elizabeth Rhea
one decent horse with saddle and bridle and
One hundred pounds to be paid to her
in Cash as hereafter directed. fifthly I give
to my sons Robert Rhea and Matthew Rhea
the twenty guineas that is due to me for Alagamy
in Ireland and in case the said twenty
guineas cannot be obtained in three years
after my decease then and in that case
I give to each of my said sons Matthew and
Robert ten pounds to be paid as hereafter directed
Sixthly I give to my granddaughters Elizabeth
Lochdat Rhea, and Sarah Rankin Rhea
one good Cow and calf each of them severally
it is my will and desire that in case any
alteration should take place in my family
so that my three daughters or any of them
should think proper to remove from my former
dwelling house then and in that case my
will is that the house over the creek by my
Cane shall by my two sons Joseph and William
be fitted up in the best manner with a good
stone chimney and other things equivalent
thereto and in that house so repaired it
is my will and desire that all or any of
them do reside as long as they are unmarried
and that the said Joseph and William
my sons shall supply my said three
daughters Jane, Sarah and Elizabeth with
a sufficiency of provisions of every kind
that is raised on the said land and also
my said sons shall sow at least one
bushel of flax seed each year and shall
keep and feed two good milk Cows as long
as they my said daughters live together in the
repaired house above mentioned and in
case any of them should chuse to separate
from the others then the quantity of provisions
to be reduced be according to the

 Rightly in addition to what I have formerly given in
 this my last will and testament to my two sons
 Joseph and William and give them my negroe
 boy named Stephen with all my estate real
 and personal of every description not heretofore
 disposed of and it is my will and desire that
 my two sons Joseph and William do pay all
 the above mentioned legacies to my other children
 from the other funds now in their hands or that may
 arise from my farm bequeathed to them with this
 proviso that the above mentioned legacies shall
 become due three full years after my decease and
 not before. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint
 my sons Matthew Rhea and Robert Rhea and
 my Cousin John Preston Junr. executors of this my
 last will Testament hereby revoking all former wills
 or testaments heretofore made. In witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
 seal this 27th day of November 1807.
