in manner following viz, first I commit my soul
to God and my body to the dust from whence it
was taken, to be there after death buried in Chris-
tian like manner at the discretion of my
executors hereafter named, And the worldly
goods, ^{with} which it has pleased God to bless me
I will and devise as follows. I will and be-
queath to my daughter Jane Saddle a horse
cott of two years old, I will and bequeath
to my son Robert White the three horse
carriages he now has in possession and a
cow four years old with a star in her face, one
red and white spotted cow six years old or
thereabouts, one three year old, three two years old
one year old steers, and four year old heifers I will
Robert and his mother equally to divide as they may
agree my flock of sheep to be by them also divided
equally as they may agree, The money due me by
bond note or Acc^t to be collected and out of it my
lawful debts and funeral charges to be discharged
and the remainder to be equally divided between
Robert and Mother my stock of hogs to be by
Robert and his mother equally divided as they
may agree my farming utensils to be by them also equally
divided. The remainder of my horses and horses
cattle my waggon all my household and kitchen
furniture I will, to my beloved ^{and} wife
Mary to by her held or disposed as

(219) She thinks fit also my Negro man Jack, my dwelling house kitchen and the half of my plantation during his natural life, I will and bequeath to my son Robert my plantation with all its appurtenances excepting as before ~~before~~ mentioned to his mother to him and his heirs forever, And lastly I constitute and appoint Samuel Scott junr and John Stewart Executors of this my last will and testament, Revoking and making void all former Wills by me made, and Ratifying and confirming this my last will and testament Sealed ~~and~~ signed and acknowledged the nineteenth day of march in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred in presence of
