County in the Commonwealth of Virginia being in Perfect Health Praised be God, for his Mercies do
Make Constatute this to be my last will and Testament as Followeth... I Give and bequeath
to *Mary* my well beloved Wife one certain black Mare which I had from my son *Jacob Starns*, and
his Saddle, and Likewise her Shirts of all my Estate — I likewise give and bequeath to my
son *David* Thirty Pounds Virginia and every Child Younger then him Twenty five Pounds
like Money — And then the Remaining Part of the Estate to be equally Divided a-
mongst all my Children (first Paying all my Just Debts) The whole Estate to be in the hands
of *Mary* my Wife and she is to have the whole Mannagement thereof untill the Children
comes of Age except she Marries, then Executors to Mannage or otherwise the Children under
age to Chuse their own Gardain if she think fit in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
Hand & Seal this 22nd day of August & in the Year of our Lord — 1778 —
