of Washington County in the State of Virginia, calling to mind the uncertainty of Life, & that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make this my last Will and Testament, in the following manner, viz;
In the first Place I give my Soul to God who gave it, and my Body to the grave, through the Merits of my
gracious Redeemer to receive the same at the Resurrection. as to my worldly estate, I dispose and Devise in the
Following manner; In the first place I direct that all my just Debts shall be Paid by the sale of my
Stocks of different kinds should the whole be needed for that purpose, and to my well beloved wife
Elizabeth Campbell, her third Part of all the residue of my Personal Estate, and her maintenance, in such
Manner as she shall think proper, out of the Profits arising from my Estate, as long as she remains in
Widowhood; but upon her Marriage, she is then to take her right of Dower in my Land, and the profits
thereafter arising from my Land and Slave, hereafter bequeathed to my Children, exclusive of my wife's
Dower, to be appropriated to the maintenance and education of my Children. Should the whole be necessary
for that purpose, if there be any surplus, it is to be Disposed of in such manner, as my Executors
herein after named, may think will tend most to the future worldly profits and advantage of my
Children. — To my son Charles Henry Campbell, I devise to the whole of the Tract of Land
whereon I live, known by the Name of Aspen-Ville, and containing by Patent one thousand
Acres, also the following Slave viz. John and Aggy, with the increase of the said Aggy. — To my Daughter
Sarah Buchanan Campbell, I devise the whole of a Tract of Land lying in the Rich Valley, and known
by the name of the big Lick, containing three Hundred and thirty Acres, also the following Slave viz.
Jesse, and Melly, with the increase of the said origin girl, Melly. — To my well beloved Wife
Elizabeth Campbell, I devise a Negro Woman named Liddy, and the Future increase of the said Negro
Liddy, if any, to be equally Devise between my said Children, Charles Henry Campbell
and Sarah Buchanan Campbell. I also direct, that if my son Charles Henry Campbell
Devise a proper Sum, a Liberal Education be given him so as to qualify him for any
of the three Learned Professions of Divinity Law or Physick which ever of them he may
make his choice, and to my Daughter Sarah Buchanan Campbell, an Education suitable to
her sex and Circumstances in Life. — I hereby appoint my well beloved Wife Elizabeth
Campbell, Executors, and William Christians, and Arthur Campbell, Executors, Execu-
tors of this my last Will and Testament, hoping they will take the Burthen of the
Execution thereof upon them. And I hereby Revoke and Disannul all other former
Wills and Testaments, declaring and pronouncing this to be my last Will and

I hereby appoint my well beloved wife Elizabeth Campbell, Executors and William Christian and Arthur Campbell, Esquires Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hoping they will take the Burthen of the Execution thereof upon them. And I do hereby revoke and disannul all former Wills and Testaments, declaring and pronouncing this to be my last Will and Testament.
