Campbell sold to Peter Scot to relieve me from a security debt on behalf of Colonel Arthur Campbell. Together with the consideration of one dollar in hand paid by the Grandmother of the said George W. H. I. A. Campbell (Molly Adams) I have given granted sold conveyed and confirmed and by these presents do give grant sell convey and confirm unto the said George Washington H. I. A. Campbell and his heirs forever one Negro Man named Harry about thirty six years of age and his wife named Wynny about the age of thirty years. To have and to hold the said Negro man Harry and the said Negro Woman Wynny unto him the said George Washington H. I. A. Campbell his Executors administrators heirs and assigns. And the said William Campbell for himself and his heirs Executors administrators and assigns the said Negro Man Harry and the said Negro Woman Wynny unto the said George Washington Hamilton Joseph Abram Campbell his heirs Executors administrators & assigns against the claim of him the said William Campbell his heirs Executors administrators and assigns and against the claim of all and every Person or Persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. Know all men by these presents that we James Mitchell & George Mitchell of Kindroghhead in the Parish of Culladuff in the County of Donegal in that part of the United Kingdom Called Ireland farmers, and Sarah Mitchell of same place Spinster, which said James George and Sarah are the Brothers & Sister of Robert Mitchell late of the Town of Franklin in Williamson County, State of Tennessee In the United States of America Merchant deceased have nominated authorized constituted and appointed and by these presents, do nominate authorize constitute and appoint and in our places and stead jointly & severally put our brother John Mitchell of Saltville near Abingdon in the County of Washington State of Virginia in the said United States of America Merchant, as our True and lawful attorney for us and in our and each of our names to sue for demands recover and receive of and ^{from} William King of Washington County & State of Virginia aforesaid the copartner of our said late brother all sum & sums of money goods Estate or Effects, which may be due & owing unto us or which may belong to us in right of our said brother as copartner of said William King, and to take all lawful ways and means whatsoever either at Law or in equity as he may Judge necessary to recover the same and bring said William King to a speedy settlement, and upon receipt or recovery of all or any part of said money Estate goods and chattles, releases receipts or other sufficient discharges for the same to the said William King to ^{make} ~~send~~ and deliver either in their own or our names as may be deemed necessary and also we do hereby Impower our said Attorney to settle in whatever manner he may deem best for & house and lot in the town of Franklin aforesaid hereby for us and each of us relinquishing all claim to the same if he shall think it necessary so to do and hereby declaring ourselves perfectly satisfied with whatever our said Attorney shall do in the premises, & binding us and each of us & our and each of our heirs Executors and adm^{rs} to stand to & abide by the same and if need be We do hereby authorize our said Attorney, to administer to the Estate of our said deceased brother Robert Mitchell in his own or our names, and to take such steps either by arrest attachment distress or otherwise as he may think proper, against all & every person & persons whatsoever for all money goods Estate or Effects, which belonged to our said deceased brother at his decease, or to which we or either of us
