kettle three pots one oven one skillet two pot racks three pair of
pot hooks two pair of fire Tongs, two shovels three Water buckets
three barrels two churns one reel one wheel and "coffee mill".

the same if he shall think it necessary so to do and hereby ~~dealing~~
ourselves perfectly satisfied with whatever our said Attorney shall
do in the premises, & binding us and each of us & our and each of our
heirs Executors and adm^rs to stand to & abide by the same and if
need be we do hereby authorize our said Attorney to administer to the
Estate of our said deceased brother Robert Mitchell in his own or our
names, and to take such steps either by arrest attachment distress or
