Know all men by these presents that I William Collins of Washington County in the State of Virginia for divers good causes & Considerations me hereunto moving, have made, ordained, authorised, nominated and appointed ^{these presents} and by do make, ordain authorise, nominate and appoint Charles Porterfield of the County and State aforesaid my true & lawful Attorney, for me and in my name and for my own proper use and benefit to ask, demand sue for recover & receive of & from James Kincaannon & John Scott executors of the last Will & Testament of William Collins dec^d. all such sums of money debts and demands whatsoever which are now due and owing unto me the said William Collins by and from the said Executors aforesaid, and to have, use & take all lawful ways and means, in my name or otherwise, for the recovery thereof by any legal process whatsoever, or otherwise and to compare or agree for the same, & for me and in my name, acquittances or other legal discharges, to make seal and deliver and to do all other acts and things whatsoever concerning the premises, as fully, as I myself, might or could do were I personally present at the

doing thereof ratifying and confirming, and by these presents allowing whatsoever my said Attorney shall, in my name lawfully do, or cause to be done, in and about the premises by virtue of these presents. This letter of Attorney from William L. Collins to Charles Porterfield was proven in Court by the Oaths of Edward Campbell & John Campbell witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded.

Agreement entered into this twenty fourth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & nine between the Rev. Charles Cummings of the one part & John Gibson of the other part both of Washington County & Commonwealth of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Charles Cummings for himself his heirs executors or administrators hath this day consented & agreed to liberate and discharge the said John Gibson his heirs executors or administrators from the force or obligation of an agreement entered into between them on the first day of December one thousand eight hundred & six, which is of record in the County Clerks office, wherein the said John Gibson his heirs executors or administrators were bound unto the said Charles Cummings his executors or administrators to find, provide for, support, & protect his son William (who is not sane) during his natural life for certain property conveyed to said Gibson specified in the said agreement which property the said John Gibson doth bind himself his heirs executors or administrators to Reconvey unto the said Charles Cummings at any time he may think proper to demand the same,
