One sorrel mair branded on the left shoulder and buttock with this CT at L8. One bay yearling horse Coatt branded on the left shoulder and buttock CC L7. To One sorrel horse Coatt branded on the left shoulder and buttock this CC L20. To One large Kettle and Oven and two pots and One Chest L6. To One sorrel horse white main and tail L5. To One bay horse with bald face L8. To One Cow and Calf a L3. It being for a bond said Galloway hath against said me for forty pounds which property I do warn and defend to said Galloway from any person or persons laying any Just Claim Right or Title this nine day of June as Witness my hand and seal the said ninth day of June 1789

die do make and ordain this as followeth my last will and

First I do allow my Executors to collect all my Just Debts
and pay all Debts Justly due by me. I do likewise give and be-
queath to my beloved wife Agnes Edmiston our Servet Mare
likewise one third of all my Cattle in Washington County and
sheep and hogs and household furniture and one fourth of all
my Books the second volume of Tracts works. excepted also the
free and unmolested the of all the improvements upon my plantation
during her life also all my farming utensils to be left upon the
plantation for the use of my wife and my sons James and
Samuel also to my son William one Bond of fifty pounds
on James Curles due the first of November 1789 also to my son

44 John one bond of fifty pounds on said Curtis due 1791 also
one bay horse 6 years old and my Stallion Colt to be
equally divided betwixt him and my son James also to my
sons James and Samuel my plantation at my wifes decease
to be equally divided betwixt them and provided either of
them should die before my wife the other is to heir the land
giving ~~ten pounds~~ ^{ten pounds} to my son John also to my son James
one Brown horse 4 years old and my son Samuel one Black
Mare also the remaining two parts of my personal property to
be equally divided betwixt my sons James and Samuel and
my Daughter Margaret also my Daughter Margaret one Black
Colt one year old also my sons James and Samuel are each
of them to pay ten pounds to purchase a horse and saddle
and School my son Roberts Daughter Agnes if she liveth
with her grandmother till she is of age.

I do likewise bequeath to my son Thomas the 2^d Volume of
Flavels works and the remaining three parts of my Books to be
equally divided betwixt my sons John James and Samuel, also
my battle upon Cumberland after my son Robert has satisfied
himself for his trouble of taking care of them to be equally divided
betwixt my sons John and James except one bow to my son William.

I do likewise appoint and ordain William Edmiston Esq^r
and Matthew Buchanan and my son John Edmiston my whole
and sole executors of this my last Will and testament in witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 25th day of
December 1788
