This Indenture made this 21st day of May 1811. Between William Enicks & James Rice his stepfather & Sarah Rice his mother of Washington County & State of Virginia of the one part, & Samuel Brown Cabinetmaker of the County & State aforesaid Witneseth. That the

said

said William Enicks by & with the consent of his stepfather & his mother hath voluntarily & of his own free will & accord put himself Apprentice to the sd Samuel Brown Cabinet maker & after the manner of an apprentice doth bind himself to serve from the day of the date hereof untill the term of seven years be fully accomplished & ended.

During all which time he the said apprentice his sd Master faithfully shall serve, his secrets keep, his lawfull commands obey, he shall do no damage to his said master or any of his, or see it done by others without letting know, or giving notice thereof to his said master. He shall not waste his sd masters goods or lend them unlawfully to any. He shall not contract Matrimony nor commit fornication within sd term. At cards Dice or any other unlawfull game he shall not play, nor haue Ale houses, Taverns or Play houses, or Absent himself without leave but in all things behave himself as a faithfull apprentice Ought to do towards his said master & all his, during said term.

And the said Master shall by the best means or methods he can Teach or cause to be taught the Art or Mystery of a cabinetmaker to said apprentice, & also provide for him sufficient meat, Drink, Clothing, washing, & Lodging fitting for such an apprentice during said term, & give him six months schooling in the fore & six in the after part of his time & at the expiration of his time furnish him with a suit of Clothing at least worth twenty dollars Exclusive his wearing apparel.

For the true performance of all & singular of the fore^{mentioned} agreements we the aforementioned Parties do jointly and severly set our hands & seals this Twenty second day of May A.D. One thousand eight hundred and eleven.
