stitute this my last Will and Testament and desire it to be
received by all as such, first recommending my body to be buried
soul to God who gave it and allowing my body to be buried in
a decent christian manner at the discretion of my Executors
then I allow all my just debts first to be paid of my Estate.

I give and Bequeath to my beloved wife one of the best of my
horses one bed and furniture and any two Cows she shall choose
out of my Stock, also my dwelling house and the third part

of my land during her co-wiveship. I give and Bequeath to my children who are now unmarried all the remainder of my Estate real and personal to be equally divided among them, reserving to my wife the power of allowing my eldest son full a greater share than the rest provided he act a decent part by her in affording her to raise the younger children also the right of having my four youngest children schooled as well as the rest. I do also constitute and appoint my beloved wife John ^{Son} my Executor of this my last Will and Testament reserving to John Power the power of appointing another person in his stead if he should move out of this County or be otherwise unable to act. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six
