lard being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks
be to God for it and calling to mind the mortality of all men do con-
stitute this my last Will and Testament and desire it to be
received by all as such, first recommending my body to be buried
soul to God who gave it and allowing my body to be buried in
a decent christian manner at the discretion of my Executors
Now I allow all my just debts first to be paid of my Estate.
I give and Bequeath to my beloved wife one of the best of my
horses one bed and furniture and any two Cows she shall choose
out of my stock, also my dwelling house and the third part

of my land during her widowhood. I give and Bequeath to my children who are now unmarried all the remainder of my Estate real and personal to be equally divided among them, reserving to my wife the power of allowing my eldest son full a greater share than the rest provided he set a decent part by her in assisting her to raise the younger children. Also the right of having my four youngest children schooled as well as the rest. I do also constitute and appoint my beloved wife John son, my Executors of this my last Will and Testament reserving to John Lowry the power of appointing another person in his stead if he should move out of the Country or be otherwise unable to act. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six

The Condition of the above obligation is such that if the above bounden John Sharp son his heirs Executors or Administrators or assigns do with and truly make or cause to be made to the said Benjamin Sharp and to his heirs full right and title to the tract or parcel of land and which said John Sharp now lives and claims lying on Beaver creek in said County above and joining the place where Jacob Watts now lives and then the above Obligation is to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue
