Be it known unto all men by these presents That I William Lewis am sick in body but in Perfect Memory therefore make this my Last Will and Test
First I Recommend my Body to the Grave and my soul to them that gave it
First I Give and Bequeath to my Son Griffith Lewis a bond of one hundred Bushels Corn due in the year 1785 Likewise I Give to my Son Griffith Lewis twenty seven Bushels Corn out of my Shop & and one black three year Old Heifer and the Lamb or Laps to Likewise I Give him all my Cloths of all sorts but one coat and gachcoat I Give and bequeath to my son Griffith Lewis and my Daughter Ann Stevens and my Daughter Margaret Bishop and all the Corn that shall be left when twenty seven Bushels is taken out of it I Give to my Son William Lewis a bond that he had of mine of six Pound and I clear him of all my Debt Accounts against him I Give to my son William and my son John Lewis a bond of one hundred Bushels of Corn due in the year 1789 I Give to my son John Lewis a book account that I have against him of seven Pounds thirteen Shillings and Six Pence I Give to my Daughter Margaret Bishop both the bond of one Cow & my Lamb & Waggon and the Cow with a white face and all my Debt Accounts between my Daughter Margaret Bishop and Ann Stevens I Give to my Margaret Bishop a Bond of one hundred Bushels of Corn due in the year 1786 my Powder I Divide between my two Daughters Margaret Bishop and Ann Stevens and my bond between my two Daughters Margaret Bishop & Ann Stevens I Give to my Daughter Margaret Bishop a bond of one in the year 1787 of one hundred Bushels of Corn & coat and gachcoat I Give to my son Griffith Lewis two sheets and bedstead one cover and I Give to my Daughter Ann Stevens one horse that shall be left for Ann Thomas Lewis a bond of one hundred Bushels of Corn due in the year 1788 and I clear him of a Debt account that I have against him for two horses that he had of

I give to Griffith Lewis Ann Stevens Margaret Bishop all the Leather to be Equally Divided amongst them I give to my son Griffith One Black Horse I give to my Daughter Margaret Bishop One Bay Mare I give to my son Griffith Lewis and Ann Stevens all my Carpenter Tools to be Divided between them as they can agree In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th Day of November in the year of our Lord 1784

The Name of Joseph Men, I Joseph Men Son of Benjamin Men, being sick and having my perfect understanding after my Last Will and Testament made and signed and Bequeath as follows I give and bequeath to my surviving wife Elizabeth all my Estate, Goods and out of the Land I have with all the Improvements and all my other Estates Current and Fixed and I give to my son Benjamin Men five pounds after he is of Age and I give to my daughter Elizabeth Men five pounds and I give to my daughter Mary Men five pounds and I give to my daughter Sarah Men five pounds and I give to my daughter Ann Men five pounds this being my Last Will and Testament I make my son Joseph Men and Elizabeth Men my Executors and I give to them the remains to them to the funeral Costs and Expenses all that the the usual custom to provide the Remainder Equally between them This being my Last Will and Testament I have hereunto set my hand and signed my Seal this 22nd Day of April in the year of our Lord 1785
