I James Kincanon of Washington of Washington County do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following Viz

1st I leave to my well beloved Wife Sarah Kincanon my three Work Horses and Black filly four Milch Cows her choice of my Cattle all my flock of Sheep & all my stock of hogs all my grain of whatever kind now in the on my plantation all my house hold & Kitchen furniture of whatever kind also half my Cash Bonds notes & Book debts to her own proper use & behoof forever. my dwelling house half my Plantation, farming utensils, together with one moiety in the Negroes, Charles, Noka & Murr during her natural life.

2nd I leave to James Kincanon son of my Brother Andrew the remaining half of my Plantation Negroes & farming utensils also my mill On condition he come within one year after my decease and live on the same during the natural life of my said Wife Sarah and at her decease to have & to hold all my lands with the appurtenances to him & his heirs forever together with the aforesaid Negroes Charles, Noka & Murr. Should James choose not to comply with the above requisitions then the whole to him named to revert to my Wife Sarah during her natural life, & after her decease to be by my Executors hereafter named sold to the best advantage, and the monies therefrom arising equally divided amongst my Brothers & Sisters to wit Andrew Frank Matthew & George Kincanons Mary Smith and
