

In the Name of God Amen. I McMillan
 McMillan of Washington County, in the State of Virginia
 aged but of perfect mind & disposing memory & taking into
 consideration the Mortality of mankind, have thought proper
 to make this my last will & Testament in writing, in manner
 and form following. Principally & first of all I recommend my
 immortal soul into the hands of almighty God to be in mercy
 received by him thro' the merits of my redeemer Jesus Christ
 and my body I give unto the earth from which it was taken
 to be buried in a Christian & decent ^{manner} according to the discretion
 of my herein after named Executors, and as touching those worldly
 estate wherewith God hath blessed me with, & which I shall be
 left at my Decease, I give, devise & bequeath in manner &
 form as herein after shall be directed.

Imprimis I give unto my beloved Wife Mary the whole
 of the income of rent charge, or yearly annuity granted unto
 me & her by my son in law Robert Davis by Indenture
 bearing date the 15th day of March A.D. 1808 to hold unto
 her during her natural life.

Item I give, devise, & bequeath unto my loving son Francis
 McMillan, my messuage or tenement & plantation containing
 four hundred & thirty three acres be the same more or less (it
 being the same tract of land granted unto me by John Davis
 & wife, by Indenture bearing date the 14th day of March A.D. 1808)
 to hold to him my said son Francis McMillan his heirs & assigns
 forever.

Item it is my will, and I hereby order & authorize my
 herein after named Executors, or the surviving or acting of them
 to sell in a convenient time after my decease a certain tract
 of land I hold by Patent, situate in Washington County aforesaid
 & containing one hundred acres be the same more or less, adjoin-
 ing lands of Abraham Hartenstein, John Gibson & the land
 I made over to my son in law Robert Davis, & that they or the
 survivor or acting of them, do give a Deed in fee simple to the
 purchaser or purchasers thereof, by virtue of this my last will
 & Testament, as if I had done the same in my life time & to
 sell the same as also my man slave George & the boy

slave Cyrus, either by Public auction or private sale, as to them or the surviving or acting of them may deem meet, & for the best price that can be gotten therefor, but my woman slave Rachel shall be retained through the natural life of my beloved wife Mary to wait upon her in her present helpless condition, but should my said slave Rachel be undutiful, and misbehaving, that they or either of them may sell her at their or his discretion and provide another nurse for my said wife Mary. And the money arising from the sale of said land & slaves, and the other of my personal estate which shall be left behind at my decease as also the debts due me after my Just debts (if I have any) & my funeral expences shall be paid I order to be distributed & divided in the following manner

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Molly who is intermarried with James Bell to be paid unto her or her representatives out of the first monies arising out of sale of my estate or payment of debts due me the sum of one hundred & sixty dollars

Item I give & bequeath unto my grand children William Davis & Mary Davis ten Dollars each, & that to be in full of all my estate having advanced their Father Robert Davis & my daughter Nancy his wife the full portion out of my ^{estate} in the exchange of land.

Item I give & bequeath unto my Granddaughter Mary the daughter of Alexander McMillan and my daughter Margaret, and intermarried with John Cartwright the sum of thirty dollars.

Item I give & bequeath unto my grand son William McMillan the son of said Alexander McMillan & my daughter Margaret the sum of thirty dollars.

Item I give and bequeath unto my grand children the Children of my sons James McMillan & Andrew McMillan, and my Daughters Janet Willoughby intermarried with Andrew Willoughby my daughter Molly intermarried with James Bell my daughter Elizabeth intermarried with James Bulcherson all the residue of my estate to be by them equally divided share & share alike, with this proviso, that all those of these my grand Children amongst them that bear my name William, or my wifes name Mary shall each of them ^{have} thirty dollars more than the others, and lastly I nominate & appoint my loving sons Andrew McMillan & Francis McMillan joint Executors of this my last will & Testament, hereby

revoking all former wills & Testaments by me heretofore made allowing this no other to be my last will & Testament. In Witn^{ess} whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the eight day of December A.D. one thousand eight hundred & nine

In the name of God amen I William McMillan of Washington County in the State of Virginia having on the eight day of December last made my last will & Testament in writing, wherein I have by I did bequeath unto my grand children of my son James with the other of my grand children all the residue of my estate to be amongst them divided as in said will is directed. Which said clause by this Codicil I in so far alter that I give & bequeath out of said money in said will mentioned the sum of one hundred Dollars in specie unto my said son James to be paid him immediately after my decease, & also I give & bequeath unto my grand son William the son of said James the sum of twenty dollars in specie which said sums to be in full for what my grand children the children of my said son James might or could claim by said recited clause in my said last will & Testament. And whereas in the aforesaid clause I did not mention who was to receive the legacies left to my said grand children, during their minority. I hereby nominate & appoint the respective parents of my said grand children as guardians of this their bequeathed estates, & that my therein named executors pay the respective legacies into their hands, as if the same had been approved by the Court. And I hereby make this Codicil as part of my aforesaid last will & Testament. And have hereunto set my hand & seal the 10th day of September A.D. 1810

This last Will & Testament of William McMillan dec'd & a Codicil thereto bearing date the 10th day of Sept. 1810 were severally exhibited into Court proven by the oath of John Campbell & Benjⁿ Spry her witnesses thereto & ordered to be recorded. And on the Motion of Andrew McMillan one of the executors therein named who took the oath of an executor prescribed by Law & entered into & acknowledged his bond with John Henderson, John Chatters, John Davis, John Teater, John Fleenor Abarn Wostenstone & John Gray, his securities in the sum of five thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs - A Certificate is therefore granted him for the probat of the said Will & Codicil in due form.
