1809 the last Will and Testament of John Crabbie deceased
was produced in Court and proven by the oaths of William
Porter and Abraham Crabbie the subscribing witnesses.
The Court then ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of
Jemima Crabbie and Phebe Crabbie the Executrix and
Executor therein named who took the oath prescribed by
Law and together with William Porter and William
Crabbie their securities entered into and acknowledged
their bond in the sum of one thousand five hundred
dollars conditioned as the law directs. A certificate is
therefore granted them for the probat of the said Will
in due form.

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In the name of God Amen. I William Roberts of the
County of Washington & State of Virginia being of sound mind
and memory, but taking into consideration the mortality of
the body & the uncertainty of life do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament in form following to wit.
1st I commit my soul to God who gave it, and my body
to the earth, to be buried in a decent Christian like
manner at the direction of my executors, In a lively
hope of a glorious resurrection to immortality & eternal
life through the merits of our Lord Jesus Christ.
2^d With respect to such worldly goods as I may be
possessed of at my decease, I dispose of in the following
manner. that is to say (After all my just debts are paid)
I give and bequeath to the Trustees of the Fund for
the relief and support of the itinerant, superannuated
and worn out Ministers & preachers of the Methodist Episcopal
Church (in the United States of America) their wives
and children widows and orphans "the sum of sixty
six dollars and two thirds of a dollar to be paid

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by my executors as soon as the sum can be raised out of the property of the estate. 3^d I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Hutchinson one head and furniture, one Cow & Calf, and a horse or mare that shall be valued to fifty dollars cash. 4th I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret the whole of my remaining estate real & personal, to be held and enjoyed by her during her natural life. And after her decease, I give & bequeath one third part of all & singular of the estate real and personal of which she shall die possessed to The Trustees of the above mentioned "Fund" to be disposed of according to the Charter of said Fund: And that the remaining two third parts be entirely at the disposal of my said wife Margaret in such manner as she may think proper. 5th And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Charles Hardy (Minister of the Gospel) and my wife Margaret Robert the Executor and Executrix of this my last Will and Testament. And do moreover revoke, and make null and void all other Will or Wills by me at any time made, declaring this and no other to be my last Will and Testament in Testimony whereof I have hereto set my hand and affixed my seal this 7th day of August 1801.
