I Lilly Bowen of Washington County and Commonwealth of Virginia do make and ordain this my last Will & Testament. — I first of all do recommend my Soul to God who gave it, and my body to the earth to be decently interred, not doubting but I shall receive it again at the general Resurrection by the Mighty power of God. — As to my worldly Goods I will and desire that they be disposed of in the following manner. — I give and bequeath to my son Henry Bowen at my death my Negro Manck Jean, also my young black mare. To my sons Peter Williams and Robert Bowen the sum of five Shillings each they having had their full share of their Father's Estate already. — To my daughter Mary included two large barones also a third part of the principal and Interest of my Loan Office Certificate of one hundred pounds. To my daughter Jean Cooney another third part, and the remaining third part of a Certificate to my son Charles. To my son Arthur Bowen a moiety or that part of the Oak Orchard tract of Land, wherein he now lives, the dividing line between him and his brother Charles to be run as they have already agreed on. — To my son Charles Bowen the remaining or that part of the said tract of Land wherein he now lives, and my Negro lad called Hyat and a Negro fellow called Jack, left him by his Father, and of which he is now wrongfully deprived of. Also together with all the remainder of my Personal Estate, not herein bequeathed, of which I may be in possession at my death, who is to defray my funeral expenses, and pay all my just debts.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Henry Bowen and Charles Bowen, Executors of this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all former Wills and Testaments by me made. — In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourth day of April One thousand seven hundred and eighty.

To my sons Peter, William and Robert Bowen the sum of five shillings each, they having had their full share of this Father's Estate already. — To my daughter Sophia a large negro, of the name of Mary, who is now in my possession, and also my share in the land which I purchased of the Indians, and which I have since sold to the said Henry Bowen, also a third part of the principal and Interest of my Loan Office Certificate of one hundred Pounds. — To my daughter Jean Looney another third part, and the remaining third part of a Certificate to my Son Charles. — To my Son Arthur Bowen a moiety or that part of the late Orchard Tract of Land, wherein he now lives, depending line between him and his brother Charles to be run as they have already agreed on. — To my son Charles Bowen the remaining or that part of the said Tract of Land wherein he now lives, and my Negro lad called Wapt, and a Negro fellow called Jack, left him by his Father, and of which he is now wrongfully dispossessed of. And together with all the remainder of my Personal Estate, not herein bequeathed, of which I may be in possession at my death, who is to defray my funeral expenses, and pay all my just Debts.

And I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons Henry Bowen and Charles Bowen, Executors of this my last Will & Testament, hereby revoking and annulling all former Wills and Testaments by me made. — In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this fourth day of April One thousand seven hundred and eighty.

And we the said John Samuel Elizabeth and Henry Livingston Catharine Wilson and William Head do by these presents warrant and defend the ^{above} described Messuage, Tract piece or parcel of land and the sorsel Mare aforesaid with her increase as above described, to the said Peter Livingston and his heirs, Executors and Administrators Against us our and each of us our heirs Executors and Administrators and all and every other person claiming by through or under us or any of us In witness whereof we have interchangeably set our hands & seals this 16th day of November 1782.
