In the name of God Amen.

The Twenty first Day of March in the Year of our Lord 1781. I William White of Washington County Virginia Yeoman, being very sick and weak in body, but of perfect mind and Memory. Thanks be given unto God for the same, and calling to mind the mortality of my Body, and Knowing that it is appointed for all men Once to die, do make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament: That is to say Principally, and first of all, I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that gave all; and for my Body I Recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian manner, at the Discretion of My Executors, nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again, by the Mighty Power of God; and, as Touching Such worldly Estate, Wherewith it hath pleased god to bless me in this Life, I Give, Devise, and Dispose of the Same in Manner and form following that is to say. In the first place, I give & Bequeath to Agnes, my Dearly Beloved Wife, to hold the Plantation that I now Live on, Together ^{with} the moveables, that is to say, all my Household furniture, Goods and Chattle, to have and to hold the same in Peaceable Possession as Long as she Remains a Widow the Children is to be raised upon the Plantation, and she is to have the Benefits of it all and Singular for the use of raising their Children, & if Any of the Children Marry and go off when the come of age they are to have their Part and share, if the Estate will or may admit of it at the same time without lay. And if my Beloved Wife see cause to Marry and change her way of life, then the Estate is to be sold and a Division made, as follows, They Boys is to have Double as much as the Girls and my Dearly beloved wife is to have as much as one of the Boys, or any of them: Only my Dear Son John if he stays and helps to Work the Place, and helps to raise the Children he is to get a share of her Pound & Land Value, and as much more and above a Boys Part and if he Does not stay, he is to have no more than a Boys Part, and if each of my Daughters amount to more than my Dear Daughter Margaret has got, already she is to get as much as any of them Rest of the Girls Including what she has got, to make her Equal with the rest of the Girls, and if the Estate cannot afford her any more, than she has got already, I also give and bequeath Her Ten Shillings good and Lawful money of Virginia to be Paid and Laid off My Estate I Likewise leave my Honour and Father the Knowledge & Love in the House he now Lives in During his life if he see cause to live in it, I also leave my Truly and Dearly Beloved Wife Agnes, to be sole and sole Executrix of all and Singular of this my last will and Testament. Together to receive and receive all the Cousing to me & theirs by Birth, Blood or Debt, Wholes Plantation

And Likewise to Pay all them that I stand now Indebted to, for the
 God and well Being of myself and the Children each one. And thereby
 Utterly Disallow, Revoke, and Disannul all and every Other former
 Testaments, Will and Legacies, requests and Executors, By me in
 any wise before named, Willed and Bequeathed that I judge, and Con-
 firming this, and no other to be my Last Will & Testament. In witness
 Whereof I set my Hand, and seal the Day before Mentioned, or
