In the name of God Amen I Christopher Doyle of the County of Westmore-
land in Virginia living of perfect memory doe make this my last will and
Testament Vnto my soul I bequeath to God who made it and to Jesus Christ
who redeemed it my body to the earth from which I received it
I bequeath my land I bequeath to Isaac Bonnis and Alexander Summitt servants to Mr. Waste
And likewise an horse I bequeath to the aforesaid persons with a balfe with
huffer and calf it to go for their good until they are free and then to fall into
their owne hands, and neither land cow nor calf to be sold by them in any of
their assignes or heirs, I bequeath my three barrels of beere which Mr. Waste owne
me I bequeath to my Countryman Oliver Wolfe and likewise two hundred
of Pork and a fitch of bacon I bequeath to my aforesaid Countryman Oliver
Wolfe I bequeath my trunk and all that is in it I bequeath to my
Countryman Edmund Kelly and Thomas Daniel equally to be divided
I bequeath my Christ I bequeath to John Sauntott
I bequeath my gun I bequeath to Edmund Kelly
I bequeath my cuttars and pockett pistolls I bequeath to my brother John Heaborn
And for to see this will performed and fullfilled I doe will and decree and leave
my Countryman Oliver Wolfe to be my sole Executor as Witness my hand
the 2^d of November 1660.

And for to see this will performed and fullfilled I do will and decree and leave
my Countryman Oliver Wolfe to be my sole Executor As Witness my hand
this 24th of November 1660.

Articles of agreement made and concluded on the 7th day of June in the
Year of our Lord 1662. Between John Smith of Newcastle in the County of
Northumberland planter of the one part and William Robinson of the same
place of the other part Witnesseth Imprimis the abovesaid parties do
hereby disannul and make void all former contracts and agreements

the division of six hundred and fifty acres of land more especially on bearing date the 20th of February 1659. Item It is covenanted concluded and agreed upon by the parties abovesaid they having a Joint Interest in a parcel of land as above said containing six hundred and fifty acres lying and being in Nomony river in the County aforesaid and being formerly granted unto Robert Geo by patent bearing date the 6th of September 1654. as may appear by the said patent that the division of the said land be made between the parties abovesaid for the future Vizt. be the said John Smith for his part is to begin at a corner marked black walnut tree standing in Wattatiggin field which is the corner marked tree of the land of Mr William Pince and the land of William Stradder and then land and to extend from the said black walnut tree south & point west 100 poles to a marked Oak thence east $\frac{1}{2}$ south to Birch bush Creek. then down the said Creek to the running Creek or main branch of Nomony and then down the said running Creek to the land of William Stradder finally up the said Stradders line to the aforesaid Walnut which land included with the said bounds is to be the land of the said John Smith And all the remaining part of the said six hundred and fifty acres according to the bounds of the said patent to be and remain unto the said William Robinson for his part In witness whereof the said John Smith and William Robinson have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and Year abovesaid
