will and Testament in manner and form following I give and bequeath
my soul ~~in~~ the hands of Almighty my most mercifull father hoping by
the death and passion of Iesus Christ his son and my alone saviour to have
remission of all my sins my body I give to the earth to be decently interred
by my last husband at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named And
as for that worldly estate which god of his mercy hath blessed me with
all I give and bequeath as followeth Improvements I give and bequeath to my
grandchild Charles Baldridge the first man coll that any of my manns shall
bring I give and bequeath unto William the son of my nephew James Bald-
ridge the first man coll that come of the boll that I have given my grand-
child Charles Baldridge.

I Give and bequeath unto my nephew James Baldridge three hogsheads
of Tobacco to be paid unto him by my Executor hereafter named.

I Give and bequeath unto Joshua the son of Thomas Walter the next
man coll that shall come of any of my manns after Charles Baldridge
is satisfied his mancoll, likewise I give to the said Joshua two bags
to be delivered unto him or to his use my Executor as aforesaid.

Give and bequeath unto John Stans one bow to be delivered to him
by my Executor hereafter named.

I Give unto John Stans and Stephen such one year of their term
of time which they were to serve a piece

I Give unto my nephew James Baldridge the great long gun
that was his fathers —

I Give It is my will and mind that Howle and Chollace be sent for out
of England this shipping and that my Executor hereafter named shall
pay two thousand pounds of Tobacco and back for them —

And I Give the said Howle and Chollace to the parish Church
of appomattox to celebrate the communion forever —

And it is my will that my name be engraven in the said Howle and
Chollace — All the rest of my whole estate in General my debts
legacies and funeral expenses be paid and discharged by my Executor
hereafter named; I Give and bequeath unto my grand children, Eliza-
beth Baynham Anne Baynham and Mary Baynham equally
amongst them and if any of my grand children should die then
the survivor to have the part or parts of her or them so dying —
