the said province of Maryland and in Westmoreland County in Virginia

and jointly As Witnesses my hand and seal in New London September
the 12th 1661.

to time hereafter if I shall be therunto lawfully required to make unto
Daniel Hutt his heirs Executors and assigns such further and future
assurance and assurances of a parcel of land sold by John Medell of
Norwomney of two hundred and fifty Acres being part of five hundred which
formerly was sold by Captain George Read unto the widow Miles which
patent was granted unto the said George Read bearing date the ninth
of June 1653. the said two hundred and fifty Acres being buttred and
bounded as followeth Vist. beginning at a marked oak standing on a
point at a marsh of a Creek called Cosh Creek and extending up norwomney
river southeast along the riverside for breadth one hundred of five
pols unto a marked red oak standing on the southeast side of a small
