perfect memory - do make this as my last will and Testament
as followeth -

Mary Alday and to her heirs forever all my lands that
I have or may have either by gift, purchase inheritance
or any manner of way, reserving only to my beloved wife
Grace Alday her third during her natural life, I Henry
I make my said wife Grace Alday my whole and sole
Executrix I Henry hereby renounce and make void all
former wills whatsoever In Confirmation whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th day of April 1670
