perfect mind and memory (praised be god for the same)
doe make this my last will and Testament in manner
and form following, I give and bequeath my soul
into the hands of Almighty God my most mercifull father
hoping by the death and passion of Iesus Christ his only son
and my alone saviour to receive full pardon and remission of
all my sins in this world and after this life ends to enjoy
everlasting happiness in the Kingdom of heaven, my body
I commit to the earth from whence it came to be decently interred
as near to my deceased father as may be at the direction
of my Executors hereafter named And as for my worldly estate
that god hath blessed me withall, I give and bequeath
as followeth — First it is my will and mind that all my
debts be justly and duly paid by my Executors hereafter
named, and the remainder of all my whole personal estate
in kindall, of what nature and quality soever it Be I give
and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Baldridge

and my son William Baldridge equally to be divided between them but it is
my will that my said wife shall have her thirds out of my said personal
estate and then to have the half of the remainder but that after my
debts and funeral expences paid that then the whole remainder shall be
equally divided between her and my said son William And it is my will
and mind that my said wife shall be guardian to my said son Wm
Baldridge during his minority. I Now I make and ordain my
loving wife Elizabeth Baldridge the full and sole Executrix of this
my last will and Testament, revoking all former wills and Testaments
by me made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
seal this 20th day of April 1664.
