Chattels moveable and Immoveable excepting only what legacies are herein
mentioned and my Executor to give security to the bond where I say to be
accountable to my brother Edward Maddison for my whole estate and if
in case that my brother Edward Dies or doe not appear within

Years after my decease then the Estate to be my Executors and if in Case
my Executors recover the mare that is now in suit then I give the first foal
to my Aunt Isham and this I ordain to be my last will and Testament
In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 10th day of
November in the year of our Lord 1659.

chattell chattels moveable immovables and servants and Land whatsoever unto

please and think fit and requisite ordaining her my full and whole Executor
of this my last will and Testament attally renouncing and revoking all former
will, whatsoever In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal
this 26th of November 1650.
