tween Cornelius Morpheus and me with all the rest of my
estate, I give and bequeath unto my son James one year
old heifer with her Increase -
lastly I doe constitute ordain and make Millicent Payne my loving wife
sole and whole Executrix of this my last will and Testament affixing my
hand and seal this 9th of December 1668.
