

Lansdowne Nicholas In the name of God amen the 11th day of November
Will 1664. Nicholas Lansdowne of the parish of St. Mary
in the County of Westmorland being of whole mind and in good and
perfect memory do and praise be unto Almighty God make and ordain
this my last will and Testament in manner and form following
that is to say First I commend my soul to Almighty God my maker
and redeemer and my body to be buried in decent manner. I Tell
I will that in all such debts and duties as I owe of right or of conscience
to any person or persons to be well and truly contented and paid by
mine Executor hereafter named or else ordain for to be paid without
any delay or contradiction and after my debts paid and my funeral
expences performed. I Tell I will that all my whole personal estate
belonging unto me be divided into two parts my bed and furniture
belonging thereto excepted, I Tell I will that also my wife shall have
one equal part to her own proper use with the bed and furniture
therunto belonging before excepted, I Tell I will that My daughter
have the other part thereof to her and her heirs forever. I Tell I will
that also my wife have the keeping and bringing up of my daughter
during her nonage And of this my present Testament I make and
ordain the said also my wife mine Executors and of the Executors
of the same I make and ordain the said bold Valentine Bylton and
John Whitstone Overseers, and I utterly revoke and annul all former
wills and Testaments whatsoever as Witness my hand and seal the
day and date above written —
