Will

{ To all Christian people to whom this present writing
may concern I Thomas Solly and greeting being in perfect sense
and memory but weak in body, and knowing all men was
born to die I therefore bequeath my body to the Earth from whence
it came and my dear soul to god Almighty that gave it, and
as for my worldly goods wherewithall it hath pleased the
Almighty to bestow me withall, I doe appoint and constitute
my dear and loving wife Elizabeth Solly my Executrix with all
my personal and real estate wherewith I am possessed at this
time in Virginia, And also what goods or servants shall at
any time or times come out of England consigned to me, I doe
fully hereby empower my said Executrix to receive the
same for her own proper use; I Thus I doe will &
bequeath the first manne foal that my mare Bonny

shall feel to my son John River, I then give and bequeath one black man
being capt in the left ear and a slitt in the crop and a slitt down the right
ear and one knife unmarked and one knife being capt in the right ear and
a slitt in the crop and a slitt down the left ear these be with their
winnings I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth River daughter
my hand and seal this 12th day of October 1663.

Barkley Lieutenant doe with the consent of the Council of state Accordingly
give and grant unto Margery Batten nine hundred Acres of land situate
lying and being in the County of Westmoreland abutting northeast upon
river southeast upon the land of Richard Cottrell northwest upon a
small creek that issueth out of a river aforesaid and southwest upon
the main woods, the said land being formerly granted unto George Mason
by patent dated the 17th of October 1655. and is due unto the said
Margery Batten as followeth Vizt. 500 Acres part hereof being formerly
assigned and sold by the said Mason unto John Dear and by the said
Dear assigned unto Edward Saunders and by the said Saunders assigned
unto Captain William Batten and by the said William Batten devised
