Articles of agreement made concluded and agreed on between
Dorcy of the one part and Patrick Spence of the other
part as followeth: Whereas there is a parcel of land
containing seven hundred and fifty Acres granted unto the above
named David Dorcy and Patrick Spence by patent from
the honorable Governor and Council of Virginia for the prevention
of future trouble it is considered concluded and agreed on by
the said Dorcy and Spence that the dividing line of or
belonging to the said land that shall for the future divide
the land between them shall begin at a marked locust
standing on the west side of ~~the said~~ swamp nigh to the land
ing of him the said David Dorcy and extending south by west
into the main Woods three hundred and twenty poles unto a
parcel of land of one hundred Acres lying part of the said
seven hundred and fifty Acres, the said David Dorcy lying to
enjoy as his share or part all that part or parcel of land belonging
to the said patent that lieth on the west side of the said
dividing line to him the said David Dorcy his heirs and assigns
further excepting any parcel of the aforesaid one hundred Acres
which is to be enjoyed and held by him the abovesaid Patrick
Spence with all and every part and parcel of land of or
belonging to the
