as followeth first I commit my soul to God my saviour and my body to the earth
my goods as followeth. I give and bequeath all my goods whatsoever unto my wife
Elizabeth Baldridge and to my son Charles Baldridge to their own use and behoof
four and doe hereby declare them to be my true and lawfull Executors to
receive all my Goods whatsoever and to pay as followeth to Daniel Houts one
hundred and odd pounds of Tobacco To Edmund Lindsey sixty pounds of Tobacco
and this I doe acknowledge to be my will and Testament At witness my
hand and seal the twentieth day of March 1658.
