Weble Williams

Will. In the Name of God am I William Weble of the
County of Westmoreland being very sick and weak but in perfect
sense and memory praised be God for it doe make & constitute
my last will and Testament, Imprimis I leuuate my Soul
to god that gave it me and my body to the dust therto be
interred with solemn and decent buriall.

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my son William Weble
the land that I now live upon as also one hundred acres of land

whereabouts which I have bought of Francis Lucy which was formerly Abraham Gilmanus, it being joining to my own land to my son William and his heirs forever. Likewise I give and bequeath to my son William Webb my land which is in the forest containing four hundred Acres lying upon the land of John Brurton to him and his heirs forever —

3rd I give and bequeath to George Campion's Eldest son William Campion one hundred —

4th I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Joane Webb the third of my whole Estate lands, Cattle movables and Immovables to her during her life time —

Lastly I give and bequeath unto my son William Webb all the residue of my Cattle, Chattels, movable and Immovable with my mare and all Incumbrance to him this day forever —

I require I do appoint my loving wife Joane Webb to be my sole and sole Exec^r of this my last will & Testament As witness my hand and Seal this 11th of January 1669.
