Will } In the Name of God amen William Wobbe of the
County of Westmoreland being very sick and weak but in perfect
sence and memory praised be God for it doe make constitute
my last will and Testament, Inprimis I bequeath my Soul
to god that gave it me and my body to the dust therein to be
interred with solemn and decent buriall

Secondly I give and bequeath unto my son William Wobbe
the land that I now live upon as also one hundred Acres of land

or thereabouts which I have bought of Francis Key which was formerly Abraham
Gilman's, it being joining to my own land to my son William and his
heirs forever. Likewise I give and bequeath to my son William Webb
my land which is in the forest containing four hundred Acres lying
upon the land of John Thurston to him and his heirs forever —
3rd I give and bequeath to George Campian's Elder son William Campian
and his heirs —

4th I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Joane Webb the third of
my whole Estate lands, Cattle moveables and Immoveables to her
during her life time —

Lastly I give and bequeath unto my son William Webb all the residue
of my Cattle, Chatties moveable and Immoveable with my ware
and the Invenare. to him this being forever —

Likewise I do appoint my loving wife Joane Webb to be my whole
and Sole Ex^{or} of this my last will & Testament As Witness my hand
and Seal this 11th of January 1669.
