In nomine I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God my maker, hoping  
that through the death and Passion of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ, to receive  
free pardon and Remission of all my Sins, and a glorious resurrection at the last  
day Item I give and bequeath unto my Son in Law Caleb Smith two Cows and  
two Calves to be delivered to him by my Executrix hereafter named when he shall  
attain the age of 17 years, Item I give and bequeath unto my Second son in Law  
John Smith, two Cows and two Calves to be delivered to him by my Executrix as aforesaid  
hereafter named. Item I give unto my Son in Law One brown Mare branded  
on the near Butt'ck with B with all her future increase to him and their heirs, Item  
I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Bailey all the Remainder of my good

ans chattels, moveables and immovables after the satisfaction of my debts & payment of my legacies above by me bequeathed, but if it should please God that my said Daughter should die before she attain the age of 17 years, then my Will is that the remainder of my Goods & chattels as aforesaid I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Ann Bayley and my Daughter Mary Bayley to be equally divided between them, and my Daughters Part to be delivered to her by my executors when she shall attain the age of seventeen years, and lastly I make constitute and appoint my brother in Law Thos Robins my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, revoking and annulling all former Will or Wills, Testament or Testaments whatsoever heretofore by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year first above written, so the above Interlined lines to be equally divided between my said Wife Ann Bayley & my said Daughter Mary Bayley was Interlined before the Signing of these presents
