

In The Name of God Amen this 11th of February in the year of our Lord 1698 and in the Ninth year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord King William, I Frances Butler Lefson of Washington Parish in the County of Westmoreland, being sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God therefor, calling to mind the Mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all Men Once to die (doe make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say first and principally I give my soul into the hands of God who gave it me, and for my body I commend it to the earth to be buried in Christian and decent burial in the Burying place on the Plantation where my Father and Mother lyes in Appamattox, Nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and bequeath and dispose the same in manner and form following, First I give and bequeath unto my Cousin Nathaniel Pope 2000 Pounds of Tobacco, Item I give and bequeath unto my Godson Lewis Pope, the son of Nathaniel Pope, two Cows with their future Increase, Item I give & bequeath unto my Cousin Lewis Nicholas one Servant of about 4 years to serve, or Three Thousand Pounds of Tobacco, to buy him one or two Cows

and four Sows, and one ^{1/2} Bed and Caneys, Item I give and bequeath all the rest
of my Estate both Real and Personal unto the Children of my loving friend Lawrence
Washington Senr. of Westmoreland and their heirs; and of this my last Will & Testament
I make and ordain Capt Lawrence Washington of Westmoreland County my
full and whole Executor and I doe hereby utterly disallow revoke & annulle
all and every other former Testaments, Wills legacies, bequests & Executors by me
in any wise before this time named Wills and bequeathed Staffing and
Confirming this and none other to be my last Will and Testament In
Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seale this 11th day
of February 1697^s
