of my Executors hereafter named, Item It is my will that my Funeral Charges  
be satisfied and paid, Item I give and bequeath unto Mary Browne the daughter  
of Original Browne and Jane his Wife all and every part and Parcell of my Immoveable  
Estate, both real and Personal, to her and her heirs forever, Item I will that an  
Inventory of the said Estate be taken, and that it remain in the hands of M<sup>rs</sup>  
Jane Browne, widow, till her daughter Mary Browne shall arrive of age or  
come to be married, Item I will that M<sup>rs</sup> Jane Browne be my whole & Sole  
Executrix of this my last Will and Testament revoking and annulling of all other  
Wills & Testaments before made by me, In Witness whereof I have set my hand  
and Seal this 30<sup>th</sup> day of March 1698.
