In The Name of God Amen I James Hardwick of the County of Westmorland
in Parish of Cople, being sick and weak in body, but of sound & perfect memory
do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following first
I give and bequeath my Soule to God that gave it me, hoping through the Merit
of my redemeer, that I shall, receive Eternal life & my body to the Earth from
whence it came to be decently buried according to the discretion of my Executors
hereafter named and as for such worldly good as God of his Mercy hath been
pleased to send me, I do give and bequeath in manner and form following
First I give and bequeath unto my Son William Hardwick, the Land & Plantation
whereon I now live, to him & his heirs forever, 2nd I give & bequeath unto my
Son Joseph Hardwick the plantation that I formerly bought of Richard
Steeman and half the Tract of Land joining to the plantation & give to him
and his heirs forever, and all my weareing Apparell, 3rd I give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Mrs Lydia Hardwick the other half of that Tract of
Land that I formerly bought of Richard Steeman, to her and her heirs forever
Likewise I give to my Daughter Lydia my Gold ring, my Silver candle Cup
and my Silver Spoon, 4th I give and bequeath unto my Son Joseph Hard-
wick my Silver hilted Sword and belt that was given me by Captain William

Hardwick and that her shall be free immediately after my decease, and receive the
 rest of his said Plantation for to maintain her, till he comes to the age of
 Fourteen, then to take his Land and his Estate, to his own possession. 5th I do
 give and bequeath to my Wifes Daughter Anne Anne Shelling in full of my whole
 Estate, 6th my Will is that my Daughter Lydia Hardwick bear and remain with
 my Son William Hardwick till she comes to the age of Fourteen, then to
 be free, I have full power to take her Estate into her own Possession, 7th my
 Will is that my whole personal Estate, that hath not been yet divided
 between my Son William Hardwick, my Wife, Ann Hardwick & Joseph Hardwick
 and Lydia Hardwick and Thomas Hardwick and James Hardwick, 8th my
 Will is that my Brother Joseph Hardwick, Henry Asbury, John Wright &
 Benjamin Blanchflower, doe equally divide the abovesaid Land, between
 my Son Joseph Hardwick & my Daughter Lydia Hardwick as soon as
 they shall think fit, and that they will be pleased to take and Inventory of my
 whole estate immediately after my decease & I do nominate, make,
 ordain and appoint my Son William Hardwick to be my whole Sole
 Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and that he prove this my last
