

to God for it, calling to mind the mortality of my body of knowing that it is
Appointed for all men Once to Die, I doe make and ordain this my last
Will and Testament, that is to say Principally and first of all I recommend
my Soul into the hands of God that gave it me, and for my body I com-
mand to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner, at the
Discretion of my Executors, nothing Doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall recover the same again by the mighty power of God, and as Touching
such worldly Estate, wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me with all
in this World, I give & leave and dispose of it in the manner and form following
Item I give and bequeath unto James Taylors son James Taylor, One feather

In the Name of God Amen I Arthur Harris being very sick & weak but of sound and perfect memory do ordain Constitute and Appoint this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, I implore I committ my soul to God that gave it hoping through the only merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ to obtain Remission of all my Sins, and a resurrection to everlasting light, and my body to the ground to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named and as for my worldly goods which it hath pleased God to lend me I bequeath as folt. Item I give and bequeath unto my dear and loving Wife Ellenor Harris the Plantation whereon I now live and so much Land adjoining as may contain 50 Acres with all the houses thereon during her life, and after her death to my Son Arthur Harris and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten, and for want of such I give unto my Son William Harris and his heirs forever, Item I give unto my Son William Harris Fifty Acres; the remaining part of my Land, lying near John Belys land, to him my said Son William and the heirs
