Carriour of Copple Parish in Westmoreland County in the Dominion of Virginia  
being of Perfect memory and Remembrance praised be god, do make & Ordaine  
His my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, first Principally  
I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty god my maker, hoping that thro:  
the Meritorious death and passion of Jesus Christ my only Saviour and  
Redeemer, to Receive free pardon and forgiveness of all my Sins, and as for  
my Body, to be buried in Christian burial at the discretion of my Executioner  
hereafter nominated, and as for my worldly Estate, I dispose of it as follows:  
I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Elizabeth Carrion all my whole  
Estate whatsoever and wheresoever that is to me belonging, and for as  
much as there is an agreement, between me and my Father in Law Mr.  
Joseph Hardwick for 200 Acres of Land, as may more at large appear  
by an Instrument of Writing under our hands and seals in the custody  
of Mr Benjamin Blanchflower, my Will and Desire is that the said  
Land may be conveyed to my loving Wife and her heirs forever, In the same  
manner as it was to be done to me; or otherwise my Father in law to pay  
her the said Two Thousand pounds of Tobacco, which was to have for  
the said Land, of my Estate in his own hands; I make my loving Wife  
Elizabeth Carrion my Sole Executrix, she paying my Just Debts, In  
Witnesse whereof I set my hand and seal the day and year above written
