

of God, and as touching such worldly estate, wherewith it hath pleased God to
fill me with in this world, I give devise and dispose of in the manner of

Bed and furniture, and one Stock bed & furniture and two and one
new bed ticks, one cow and heifer, of my proper mark, and one pair of
Sheets, Item I give unto Abraham One Iron Pot and Hooks, Item I give
unto my Daughter Katherine One Cow when she comes of age and one yel-

new bed ticks, One Cow and heifer, of my proper mark, and one pair of
Sheets, Item I give unto Abraham one Iron Pot and Spoon, Item I give
unto my Daughter Katharine One Cow when she comes of age and one Gold
Ring and One Tankard, and all her Mothers wearing apparel, Item I
give

gave unto my Son Abraham, One Pillar, Item I give unto my Son Abraham
 One Deale Chest, the best Chest, Item I give all the rest of my household goods
 to be equally divided between my Three Children, when they come of Age only
 giving Abraham his first Choice, Item I leave Charles Tyfey & John Chilton
 Executors of my whole Estate, but in case the said Charles Tyfey or John
 Chilton should die, or either of them Should die, the other shall putt in whom
 he thinkes fit to look after the Children, and what they have, As witness my
 hand and Seal the day and year above written
