

In The Name of God Amen the 15th day of March 1698 I John Heweling of Washington Parish in the County of Westmoreland being sick and weak of body but of perfect Sound mind & memory, thanks be therefore given to God therefor calling to mind the Mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all Once to Die doe make and ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following, first and Principally I give my Soul to God who gave it me, and for my body I commend it to the Earth, to be buried in Christian & decent manner, as to my Executor hereafter named shall be thought meet and Convenient, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God, and as Touching such worldly Estate, wherewith it hath pleased God in this life to bless me with I give & devise, bequeth & dispose the same in manner & form following, Item I give unto my God Daughter Margarett Hewelling one Red heifer, about two years old, marked flower & blue on the right & a crop & two Sides on the left, with all her increase; Item I give unto Lawrence Abington my new Kersy Coat & hatt and Leather Breaches; Item it is my Will that all the rest of my Estate be sold at an Outcry, and Tobacco to be made of it & the said Tobacco equally divided (after all persons are satisfied) between my two Sons William Hewelin and Thomas Hewelin at the full age of sixteen, if either of them die before the time, the Survivor to possess his part; Item I desire that my two Sons be brought up in the fear of God and to read proper English Item It is my Will that if my two Sons should die before they come to full age of sixteen, that then what Tobacco there shall be remaining to my two Sons;

above. disposed, Now I will that Laurence, Abbingdon be my full & sole Executor of
 this my last Will & Testament and I doe hereby utterly disallow, revoke & annulle
 all and every other former testaments Will, Legacies, or Executors by me in any place
 before this time named, willed & bequeathed, ratifying & confirming this and none other to
 be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and fixed my Seale the day and year above specified; And because for
 my will & pleasure is, that my Son William Hewelin have my Gun, and that she
 be new stocked, as soon as convenient to serve
