

In The Name of God amen I John Newton of Lower Machodack
in Westmoreland County in Virginia being in perfect health & sound mind
make this my last Will and Testament this 1st of August 1695 hereby
revoking all other Wills and Testaments whatsoever, and first I command
my Soul to God, believing for eternal rest of Salvation through Jesus Christ
my Saviour, and my body I desire to be decently buried by my Executors
hereafter named upon some of the Land which I have purchased and
my worldly goods which God hath graciously given me I give as
followeth Item I give unto my Eldest Son John of his heirs of affreigns
forever, what Land I have at Cantor & Carnisforth in Yorkshir and
that house in Hull which was my Fathers, the Land I bought of
Joseph Laycock and also I give him of his four Children One Thousand
pounds of Tobacco apiece, and I give unto my Son Joseph Newton and
his three Sons 1000^{lb} of Tobacco Apiece, and I give unto my Son Benjamin
Newton and to his Daughter one Thousand pounds of Tobo: apiece; and
that Thousand I give to John & to Joseph and to Benjamin, I will it be
paid them at my Death by my Executors; and the Thousand apiece to each
of Grand-children, I will that my two sons Gerrat Newton & Thomas Newton
pay it equally between them, the first year after the death of my Wife
unto each grand Childs owne Father for the use of their Children and
they to pay it to each Child as they shall attain to 18 years of age
and further I give to my Son John Newton, Joseph Newton & Benjamin
Newton and to their Widows, if they continue their widows, so long that
they shall be sole free her then shall he i

hereafter named upon some of the Land which I have purchased and
my worldly goods which God hath graciously given me I give as
followeth, Item I give unto my Eldest son John of his heirs of assigns
forever, what Land I have at Carlton & Barnsforth in Yorkshir and
that house in Hull which was my Fathers, the Land I bought of
Joseph Laycock and also I give him of his four Children One Thousand
pounds of Tobacco apiece, and I give unto my Son Joseph Newton and
his three Sons 1000^{lb} of Tobacco Apiece, and I give unto my Son Benjamin
Newton and to his Daughter one Thousand pounds of Tobo: apiece; and
that thousand I give to John & to Joseph and to Benjamin, I will it be
paid them at my Death by my Executors; and the Thousand apiece to each
of Grand-children, I will that my two sons Genat Newton & Thomas Newton
pay it equally between them, the first year after the death of my Wife
unto each Grand Childs owne Father for the use of their Children and
they to pay it to each Child as they shall attain to 18 years of age
and further I give to my Son John Newton, Joseph Newton & Benjamin
Newton and to their Widow, if they Continue their widows, so long that
they shall be sole free for their whole families Seven years after my
Death, at either my Mill at Totashir, or at my Mill in the freshes of
Rappahannock river which they please to make use of, but if their
Widow Marry then to be no longer sole free; Item I give to my Son


Grant that 1000 acres of Land I bought of Thomas Scott with all the over meadow
contained within the bounds which layeth in the firth of Rappahannock River of
the Mill which I have buill there, to him and the heirs males of his body lawfully
begotten and for want of such heirs then to my Eldest Son John Newton and to
the heirs males of his body lawfully begotten and for want of such heirs then I
give the said Land and Mill to Joseph Newton my Son and from him to his Son
John and the heirs Males of his body lawfully begotten, and for want of such
heirs then I give the said Land & Mill to my right heirs at Law forever, but this
Gift of this Land and Mill is with this reservation, that my said Son Gerat or
they to whom it shall @cend to at my death shall pay four Thousand pounds
of Tobacco to John Newton & Children, as I have before devised, and my said Sons
John, Joseph & Benjamin and their widows shall be tolle free as above, and also
pay to my loving Wife his mother, five Thousand Pounds of Tobacco of Cattle every year
during her life in Lieu of her thuds or @cuer hereof, I likewise give to my said
son Gerat Newton four negroes Tim, Nan, Will and Sarah, and the Increases
of their bodies from this date, and to enter as above of all at my death, I give
I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Newton my Moity & half part of that
2150 acres of Land formerly Henry Wallers, and now granted to myself Colonel
Stighugh by deed from the Proprietors office, he have promised to take no advantage
of Survivorship, to her and to the heirs males of her body lawfully begotten, and for
want of such heirs then I give the said Land to John Newton my Grandson, the Son
of Joseph Newton and to the heirs males of his body lawfully begotten, and for
want of such heirs then I give the said Land to my right heirs forever, also I give my

of his body lawfully begotten 350 acres of Land at Totashy which I bought of
of Mr Swillient and my Mill at Totashy with the two acres of land belonging
to her, but for want of such heirs then I give this said Land & Mill unto
Benjamin Newton my son and to the heirs males of his body lawfully begotten
and for want of heirs then I give the said Land and mill unto my right heirs at
law forever, but this gift of this Land & Mill is with this reservation that my
said Son Thomas or they to whom it shall descend to at my death shall pay
4 Thousand pounds of Tobacco to the other 4 of my grand children, 3 of Joseph,
Children and 1 Daughter of Benjamin as is before devised, and my 3 Sons John
Joseph of Benjamin & their Widows shall be sole free as above and also pay
unto my loving Wife his Mother 5000^{lb} of Tobacco & Caskes every year during her
life in Seine of her thirds of Dower hereof, I further give to my said Son
Thomas Four Negroes Cuffey Pig, Jack & Moll and the Increase of their
bodies from this date, and to enter of all as above at my death, and lastly
I give to my loving Wife Roase, the use and labour of a Negro Girl and
the use of my Plates for her life, and then the girl and her increase and my
plates I give to my Daughter Elizabeth as is before expressed also I give
my said loving Wife five Thousand pounds of Crop Tobacco and Caskes ann^{ually}
yearly and every year during her life to be paid her by her son General out
of the profits of the Land and Mill before devised unto him and in Seine
of her thirds and Dower hereof and five Thousand pounds of Tobacco a year
her life to be by her Son Thomas paid out of the profits of the Land and
Mill before devised unto him and in Seine of her thirds of Dower hereof
Also I give her the labour and use of a Negro Frank & Negro Sue for her
life, and at her death if living then to be equally divided between my

bodies from this date, and to enter of all as above at my Death, and Lastly
I give to my loving Wife Rose, the use and labour of a Negro Girl and
the use of my Plate for her life, and then the girl and her increase and my
plate I give to my Daughter Elizabeth as is before expressed also I give
my said loving Wife five Thousand pounds of best Tobacco and Carker ~~and~~
yearly and every year during her life to be paid her by her son Genet out
of the profits of the Land and Mill before devised unto him and in Lieu
of her third and Dower hereof and five Thousand pounds of Tobacco a year
her life to be by her Son Thomas paid out of the profits of the Land and
Mill before devised unto him and in Lieu of her thirds & Dower thereof
Also I give her the labour and use of a Negro Frank & Negro Sus for her
life, and at her death if living then to be equally divided between my
3 Sons John, Joseph and Benjamin, they first being Valued, and then cast
lots, which Brother shall have them, he paying his other Brother their
proportions; The rest of all my worldly goods not hereby devised, I give to
be equally divided amongst my 4 Executors hereafter named they paying
all my just Debts, this my gift to my Wife is in Lieu of all her
Dowers paraphernalia and pretended Claims whatsoever; I make appoint
and ordain my loving Wife, my Son Genet Newton my Son Tho' Newton
and my Daughter Elizabeth Newton to be my sole and absolute Executors
to perform this my last Will, and I earnestly intreat my loving friend Colond

William Fitzhugh to advise and assist my said Executor, and in case of any
to decide all matters between them I hereby commanding my 3 Children and
Instructing my Wife to accept of his Judgment, and so not to go to Law, In

This Codicell made by me the Subscruber this 21st Day of December 1896

Declareth that my Son Gerrat shall not pay his Mother five Thousand pounds
of Tobacco a Yeaire because the profits of the Mills will not bear it, and
therefore he shall only pay her two Thousand pounds of Tobacco yearly for her
life instead thereof also that Gerrat shall not have the ~~with him~~ named Negro
Will as also that Gerrat shall not be one of my executors, only the other three
sons Thomas and Elizabeth shall be my executors, and that I give Gerrat
all Cattle Hogs &c which belongeth to me, that is now or shall be on his
plantation at the little falls, I also confirme to him & his Wifes Rebecca a
small Deed of gift I made to him and her when I was up to see them first
at their Plantation, about the begining of October last and it is then dated and
is for five hundred acres of Land where they live, taking the whole length of the

 Daughter Elizabeth and the heirs males of her body forever lawfully begotten
 and for default of such heirs to my right heirs at law forever, and
 whereas I have before bequeathed the said land in the above Codicile (viz)
 200 acres thereof to my Grandson John, the son of Joseph, and the rest
 of it to my right heirs at law. I hereby revoke the said clause & every
 part thereof, and whereas I have in the body of my Will given and
 bequeathed the moiety of that 2150 acres formerly Harry Wallers and now
 granted by Deed to Colonel Fitzhugh and myself out of the Proprietors
 Office, in which Colonel Fitzhugh hath promised to take no advantage
 of survivorship) to my Daughter Elizabeth and the heirs of her body law-
 fully begotten, and for want of such heirs, then to my right heirs forever, I
 hereby revoke that clause next above to all intents & purposes, giving and
 bequeathing all my said moiety of the 2150 acres of land aforesaid to my
