

the next ensuing year, the Tobacco to remain in the hands of Benjamin Blanch
flower my Executor hereafter named & W. Robert Sanford Sen^r & to be drawn
out from thence at the pleasure of the said Sarah Clarke for her own use
Item I give and bequeath to Bennetta Buckley her Mothers Trunk & what Cloaths
of her Mothers shall be found in it at my Death & three Thousand pounds of Tobacco
when she comes to the age of Twenty One or Marry which shall first happen
Item I give and bequeath unto Richard Sutton Ten Thousand pounds of Tobacco
when he attaines to the age of 21 years, Item I give and bequeath unto Richard
Middleton what he shall stand Indebted to me at the time of my Death, Item
I give and bequeath unto Richard Sutton and to the heirs males of his body
