and my Eldest Son William now liveth upon) to my Sons that is to say my Son William Simmonds & to my Son Jacob Simmonds to them and their heirs forever, that is to say the upper half to my first born W<sup>m</sup> Simmonds and his heirs and the lower half wherein I now live to my younger Son Jacob Simmonds and his heirs forever, to be equally divided between them both at equal charges, I <sup>do</sup> will and bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Allison my bed and bedstead and all its furniture thereunto belonging, and one brass Kettle, the biggest that I have, and one great Pair Potts hangers of an Iron Spitt, One warming Pan, & one looking Glass, two Pewter Dishes, two Plates a Draper Table Cloth, & half a Dozen of Draper Napkins, two Chairs, I <sup>do</sup> Will and bequeath to my Son William Simmonds one great Pott, and one large Chipping pan, One feather Bed, two Pewter Dishes and two Plates, One Stew Pan, a Draper Table Cloth & half a Dozen of Draper Napkins, two Chairs and six Sheep. I <sup>do</sup> Will and bequeath to my Son Jacob Simmonds a feather bed and furniture belonging to it, the two Pewter Dishes of two Plates that stands upon the cupboard in the hall and a Can and basket & two Iron Potts, a Pair of Pott hangers, one gun or great Chest and all my Cows and Stock, both of Horses and Cattle if sheep and all my Tobaccos, I <sup>do</sup> Will and bequeath to my Son Thomas Simmon a little couch feather bed, and all the feathers in the house and the furniture belonging to it and two Iron Potts, two Pewter Dishes and two Plates a Draper Table Cloth and half a Dozen Draper Napkins.

and for the rest of my householde goods my Will and desire is that it be equally divided amongst all my children, & by my Will and desire that my two Sons, William Simmons and Thomas Simmons may be joint Executors of this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written Signed Sealed Moulded in presence of us.
