cretion of my Executor nothing doubting but at the General resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty Power of God, and as touching such
worldly Estate wherewithal it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give
leave and dispose of the same in the following manner and form, In witness
I give and bequeath to the said my dearly beloved wife, whom I constitute make
and ordain my only sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, all &
singular of my lands, Messuages & Tenements, Money, goods, chattels, by her
freely to be professed enjoyed, and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke
and disannull all other Testaments, Wills & Legacies, Bequests & Executors by me
in any manner before this time named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying & confirming
this the other to be my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and sealed the day and year above written

and Disannull all other Testaments, Wills & Legacies, Bequests & Executors by me
in any manner before this time named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying & Confirming
this the other to be my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand and sealed the day and year above written

Mankind, and that I am mortall as others, being sick and weak in body yet of
perfect memory, I thought fit to make this my last Will and Testament; First of
all I committ my Soule to God that gave it and my body to Christian Burial
according to the direction of my Executrix which is my loving Wife Mary Pears and
all Thomas Gelson; Next of all I desire that my Funeral Charges, and all my
lawfull Debts which I am indebted shall be paid and discharged out of my
Personal Estate and the remainder to be equally divided between my Wife and
my Son that is to say the one half to my loving Wife Mary Pears & the other
half to my dutifull Son George Pears, Likewise I give to my loving Wife
Mary Pears this Plantation, lying and situated at upper Machodack Creek in
Westmoreland County (the which I doe now occupy & possess) during the tenure of her
life, and after her life the same Plantation to go unto the possession of my
Son George Pears or his heirs forever Likewise my land in the Forest that is to
say the Plantation that my Tenant Christopher Rodgers doth now occupy and
possess, I give the one half to my loving Wife Mary Pears during the tenure of her
