in Cople Parish in Westmoreland County in Virginia (Planter) on the one Part
and John Baller of the same place in the Parish and County aforesaid (Planter)
on the other Part. Witnesseth that the said Samuel Bonum & Margaret his
wife for and in Consideration of the sum of Five Shillings of Three and haufpue
Money of England to them in hand Paid by the said John Baller, at an
before the sealing and delivery of these Presents, the Accept whereof they
do hereby Acknowledge, have bargained and sold, and by these presents doth
bargain and sell unto the said John Baller one Mespuaige or Tenement of
990. Acres of Land Situate lying and being in youcomes in the Parish and
County aforesaid by such Meats and bounds as hereinafter is mentioned and
Caprefied (viz) upon the Land of Jeremiah Jadwin, and the Land of Alexander
Spence, and the Land of William Daine, which land formerly being granted
unto Mr William Reynolds deceased, and upon the Land of William Barr
and upon the Land of James Coleman and upon the head of a Brook or branch
formerly called rotank, and now commonly called Tucknall.
