This Indenture made the 25th day of January in the fourth year
of the reign of our Sovereign Lord and Lady King William & Queen Mary by the
grace of God of England, Scotland, France and Ireland, Defenders of the faith
Anno dom 1691. Between Samuel Bonum & Margaret his Wife of youcombes
in Copls Parish in Westmoreland County in Virginia (Planters) on the one Part
and John Baker of the same place in the Parish and County aforesaid (Planter)
on the other Part. Witnesseth that the said Samuel Bonum & Margaret his
Wife for and in Consideration of the Sum of Five Shillings of True and Lawfull
Money of England to them in hand Paid by the said John Baker, at and
before the sealing and delivery of these Presents, the Receipt whereof they
do hereby Acknowledge, have bargained and sold, and by these presents doth
bargain and Sell unto the said John Baker one Messuage or Tenement of
990 Acres of Land Situate lying and being in youcombes in the Parish and
County aforesaid by such Meets and bounds as herein after is mentioned and
Expressed (VIZ) upon the Lands of Jeremiah Sadwin, and the Lands of Alexander
Spence, and the Lands of William Dains, which Land formerly being granted
unto Mr William Reynolds deceased, and upon the Lands of William Barr
and upon the Land of James Coleman and upon the head of a branch or branch
formerly called cotank, and now commonly called Tuckers D.
